
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


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PATIENTS TREATED IN MEDICAL CAMPS IN FLASH FLOOD AFFECTED AREAS-KPK








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

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Highlights:

- Flood Emergency Control Room at Directorate General Health Services, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa along with Districts across the province are operationalize round the clock, with pro-active staff working for active surveillance robust response to all kind health related emergencies due to flood in the province
- First health cluster meeting conducted under the chairmanship of Secretory health Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and co-Chaired by Director General Health Services (DGHS-KP). The partners were requested to identify the areas where health department can be facilitated in terms of human resource deployment, emergency medicine, and logistic for immediate relief to flood affected population.
- The chair directed chief health sector reforms unit (HSRU), to prepare the matrix which shall include available resources, gaps and identify who will fill the gaps with timeline.
- DGHS stressed on wash cluster and also sharing of uniform template for the status of damage of Health facilities and need assessment of all the flood affected districts across the province.

Damages:

- As communicated by District Health Officer from 19 districts the report of damages of different health facilities are as follows
 - Partially damaged Health facilities are 49
 - > Fully Damaged Health facilities are 21
 - Health Facilities which are completely submerged are 12
 - Health Facilities which are completely washed out are 10



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Human Resource Involved:

 A total of 336 health providers (including Medical Officers, Para medical Staff, Lady Health Visitors and supportive staff) of Health department is performing duties in all 103 health camps in addition to all the primary and secondary hospitals of the districts

Stocks:

- At the moment no stock of emergency medicine is available.
 However, medicine available from other projects are being utilized for Flood Emergency needs.
- The emergency medicine demand of Chitral lower, Malakand, Nowshera, Tank, Kohistan Lower, Swat, DI Khan, Shangla, DHQ hospital Nowshera and Pabbi Hospital nowshera has been fulfilled from the office of DGHS to cope with flood emergency.

Challenges:

- There is no emergency fund for responding to flood emergencies.
- Health department is forecasting potential disease outbreaks in upcoming days because of polluted water and displaced population.
- Transportation of Medicine to affected areas as communication is disrupted in most affected areas.
- Logistics support to health staff for surveillance and response activities in the affected areas.
- Safe Drinking water and personal hygiene.
