This shall include knowledge in health data bases, networks and patient-oriented IT-services and related data protection and security. Additional specialized expertise in health service administration including hospital management and health economics are expected. The specializations shall be complemented by a broader understanding and experience in design of social protection schemes, in particular experience with designing and costing of benefit packages for social protection, including but not limited to (insurance).
